Those needing a warm place to stay included 25 Benedictine monks from nearby Conception Abbey, neighbors and several of the sisters' employees and their families.

"When we learned that so many around us were without essentials like electricity, heat and water, our immediate response was to welcome them into our midst," Clyde Prioress Sister Pat Nyquist, OSB said. "Because of our generator and a backup water supply we had all that was needed to offer assistance. We felt it was a great privilege and a blessing to be able to share the gifts God has so abundantly given us."
